▶ 1754-1763 Seven Years War between France and England. In North America it is also known as the French and Indian War. The American Indians supported the

French but the British won.

▶ 1776-1783 American Revolutionary War- The American Indians supported the British hoping that the British would stop the settlers from taking land.
